On April 18th the Cavanaugh Flight Museum has the distinct honor to welcome the Doolittle Raiders for a luncheon, symposium and book signing at the museum as part of the Doolittle Raiders 66th Anniversary Reunion.

The *Doolittle Tokyo Raid* took place on April 18th, 1942, just over four months after Pearl Harbor. In the first strike by the United States against the Japanese home islands after Pearl Harbor, sixteen crews led by then Lt. Col. James H. "Jimmy" Doolittle flew B-25 "Mitchell" bombers off the aircraft carrier *USS Hornet*. The mission was a success; the B-25s surprised the Japanese and they were able to attack strategic military and industrial targets. Every year on the anniversary of their brave mission the Doolittle Raiders meet in different cities around the country. This year they will be visiting the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex. Along with the Frontiers of Flight Museum and the Cavanaugh Flight Museum, the Raiders will also visit the History of Aviation Collection at the University of Texas at Dallas, which has an extensive archive of papers, artifacts and memorabilia from the late General James H. "Jimmy" Doolittle.
